Puffins on St Kilda 53 may have held half the Puffins on the island The remaining Puffins were concentrated mainly in four areas These were, in probable order of decreasing size: the Cambir, especially around Geo na Stacan; the northeast coast between the Gap and Gonachair, including numbers on lower slopes such as both cliff faces of Aird

St Kilda has been the object of great curiosity for many centuries One of the earliest, and most influential, accounts is that of Martin Martin, who visited the island in 1697 and published a description of the customs and culture of the inhabitants of this remote island
